## **SUMMER SCHOOL 2010**

Masconomet will offer summer school courses for remediation and enrichment during July and August. The remedial courses will enable students to make up courses failed during the regular academic year. Both programs are described in detail below.

### **Remedial Program**

Any student who has failed either or both semesters of one or more of the following required courses should select the appropriate summer school option. Mastery of the objectives of these courses is required before the student will be allowed to continue in the required sequence of courses in that department. Permission to pursue a remedial option other than the Masconomet Summer School must be obtained in writing from the Senior High School Principal prior to the end of June. Some students who have failed due to chronic truancy or other attendance problems may be required to repeat the course rather than attend summer school.

Students going from Grade 8 to Grade 9, who are recommended for summer school, have two options:

- Those scheduled to take Algebra I (cont) in Grade 9 should take the three-week program in Basic Math Skills;
- Those scheduled to take Geometry in Grade 9 should take the six-week course in Algebra I.

Courses will be offered in two-hour blocks at the times listed below and will meet Monday through Friday. Parents must arrange their vacation plans around summer school if their child is to be successful.

Students may not take vacation during summer school.

### **Enrichment Program**

#### **Connections in Mathematics:**

Students who score below 240 on the grade 8 MCAS mathematics test are required to take this course in preparation for the grade 10 MCAS mathematics test. This requirement may be met as a 3 week summer course or as a semester course during the school year. Students choosing to meet the requirement during the summer may select the session and time they will attend. The options are listed below. For Summer 2010 this program is funded through a grant from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education so the \$150 tuition is waived.

Session One: Thursday, July 1 through Thursday, July 22:

8:00 am – 10:am      or      10:15 am – 12:15 pm

Session Two: Friday, July 23 through Thursday, August 12:

8:00 am – 10:am      or      10:15 am – 12:15 pm

#### **Comprehensive Health Education:**

Successful completion of this 3-week intensive program will satisfy the Health graduation requirement. This is an intensive program with homework to be done between classes. This is not a remedial program for those who have previously failed the course. Incoming freshmen (Class of 2014) are not eligible to take this course. The summer Comprehensive Health Education course is a combination online and regular class. There is daily online coursework blended with mandatory class time. The online portion of course begins on July 7 and the last online assignment must be submitted by July 29. Regular classes will meet 3:00 – 6:00 pm in Room 108 on July 12, July 15, July 19, July 22, July 26, July 28 and July 29.

Tuition: \$150.

A separate registration for this course is available in the guidance office of the High School.

#### **Computer Camp I:** July 12 – July 16, 9:00 am – noon

Learn Macromedia Flash to create interactive computer-based animations. Major project will include the creation of an animated drum set. You will be able to post this drum set on-line and send to your friends via email.

Tuition: \$100

Maximum #: 12

#### **Computer Camp II:** July 19 – July 23, 9:00 am – noon

After completing Computer Camp I, you will apply your new Flash skills to create a fully functioning video game. You will be able to post this game on-in and send to your friends via email.

Tuition: \$100

Maximum #: 12

**A student may enroll in a maximum of two summer school courses (or one 6-week course and two 3-week courses). The tuition is \$300 for courses that are scheduled to run for 6 weeks and \$150 for courses scheduled to run for 3 weeks.**

**Summer school begins on July 1 and ends on August 12.**

***All students attending a remedial summer school course should report at 8:00 am on Thursday July 1. These students will be notified before they leave school that day as to their schedule for the rest of the summer.***

Students are scheduled according to the following priorities:

- Students who need to take two classes are able to do so
- Class size is balanced as much as possible so that each student's needs can be met
- Student preference as to class time

To receive credit for a summer school course, the student must demonstrate mastery of the material. The student will be given the opportunity to demonstrate mastery any time after Thursday, July 22 (three weeks into the program) if he/she has been present in 85% or more of the class sessions and has completed all work to the satisfaction of the teacher. **Most students will need to remain the entire six weeks to complete requirements of the courses.** A student whose attendance level is below 85% on Thursday, August 12, will not receive credit for summer school.

Grades received in the remedial summer school will appear on the student's transcript as Pass or Fail and will not be used in the calculation of his/her grade point average. The student's original grade will also appear on the transcript.

Registration for summer school should be completed by June 30<sup>th</sup> although late registrations will be accepted.

Full payment of tuition must be included with the registration form.

Registration forms will be available after June 1<sup>st</sup> in the Guidance Office, Senior High School Principal's Office and on the Masconomet web page.

If the course does not run, your money will be refunded in full. If you decide not to take the course prior to June 30, you will receive a complete refund.

Students who leave the program after June 30 will not receive a refund.

Summer school begins on Thursday, July 1 and ends on Thursday, August 12.

**There are no classes on Monday, July 5.**

**All students taking remedial courses in summer school should report at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 1.** Students will be notified before they leave school that day as to their schedule for the rest of the summer.

Students taking an enrichment course should report on the date and time selected above.
